NEW HAVEN, CONNECTICUT — The European Centre for Architecture Art Design and Urban Studies and The Chicago Athenaeum: Museum of Architecture and Design have announced that New Haven, Connecticut-based Pickard Chilton has won a 2012 Green GOOD DESIGN Award for the firm's design of BG Group Place in Houston, Texas.

From thousands of submissions from over 20 countries, the jury selected over 100 outstanding examples of Green Design. Award recipients represent the world's most recognized design firms and FORTUNE 500 corporations that use innovative design to emphasize solutions to promote a more sustainable environment worldwide.

"It is rewarding to have this highly collaborative team effort recognized with this prestigious and significant award."

This is the fourth year The European Centre and The Chicago Athenaeum have held the Green GOOD DESIGN award program, a specialized edition of the GOOD DESIGN program, which was founded in Chicago in 1950 by architects Eero Saarinen and Charles and Ray Eames. The program's intent is to emphasize the importance of sustainable design and to develop a public awareness program to the international general public about which companies are best utilizing sustainable design.

"In September 2012, the organizations will organize a special Conference on the Environment and the winning 2012 Green GOOD DESIGN products and buildings will be exhibited. The exhibition opens at the University of Illinois, Champaign/Urbana and travels around the United States through 2013.
